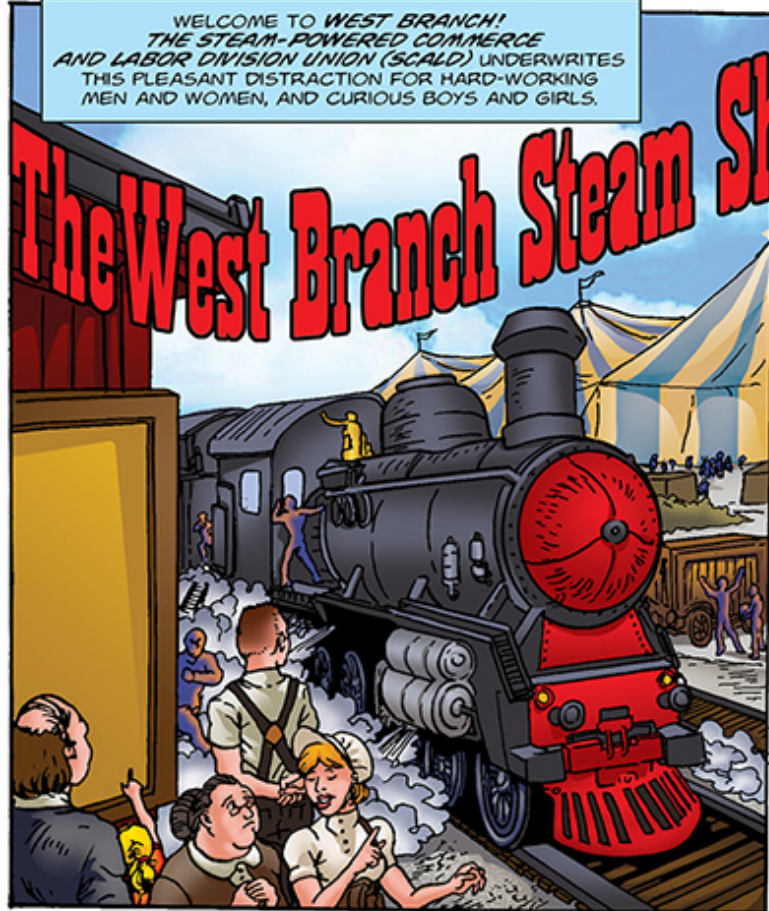

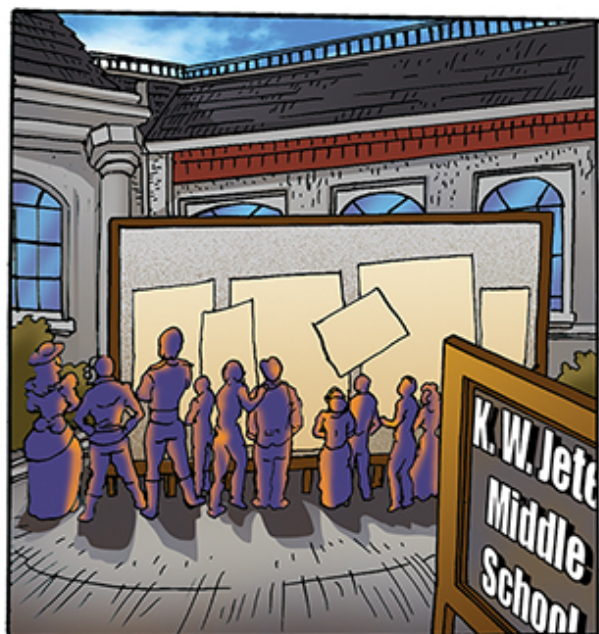


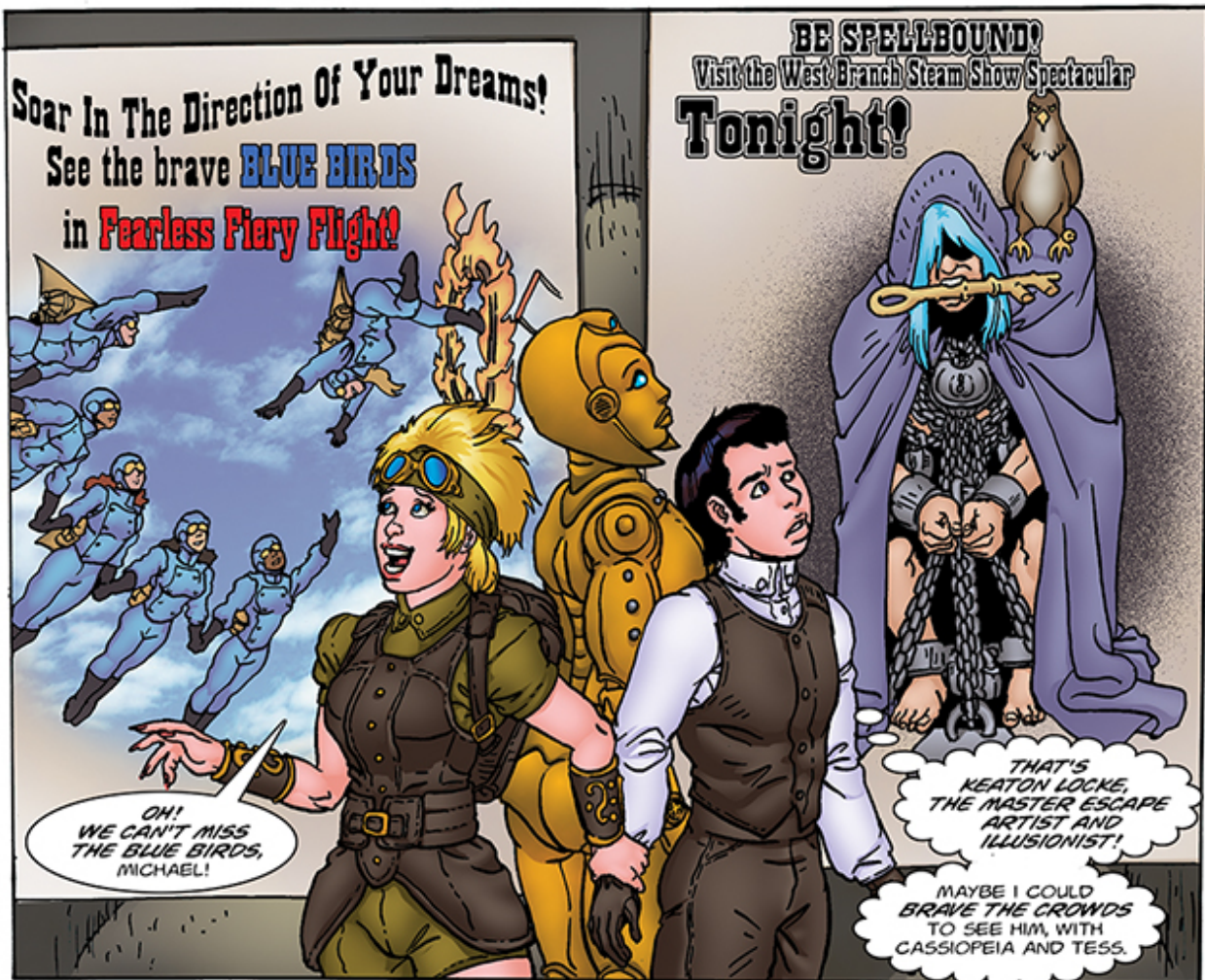

Safety Tips for Protecting Children (with or without ASD), in Large Social Events*

- Pack snacks and water to avoid aimless wandering.
- Safely explain any newly anticipated sight and sounds.
- Same-colored clothes helps be seen as a group or a lost individual.
- Pre-program an alarm device to announce the next scheduled event.
- Carry picture identification cards with emergency contact information.
- Maps can show restrooms, "must-see" attractions, and meet-up landmarks.
- Practice a group code word to yell in case of emergency, and/or...
- Teach children how and why to use a whistle for emergencies, and give group members one.
- Cameras can capture most-recent images of a child, which could be shared quickly if needed.
- Group photos make good memories last a lifetime, and build confidence in social situations!

Vocabulary Words

Addle Plot: A person who ruins the fun of others.

Baker-Knee'd: With anxious or nervous knees knocking together, as if kneading dough.

Betwattled: To be confused or surprised.
